The Captain General telegraphs that the combined operations of the columns of Chinchillas, Fijanto and Montani have produced excellent results. Seventy-six repels, including eight chiefs and two citizens of the United States, have been killed, and twenty-two

taken prisoners. The rebel Colonel Bembeta's equipage and correspondence have been captured. Colonel Chinchilla, who is a nephew of Regent Serrano, was severely wounded. Colonel Berger reports that his detachment has killed twenty-five masarrent.
