CUBA. The West India Cable to be Subarraged Immediately—Fight Near Moron—"rebable Cuban Victory. HAVANA, July 11, 151. A telegraphic despatch from Clenfueges announces

the artival at that port yesterday of the Panama and West India Cable Company's steamers Data and Suffolk, and the British man-of-war Vestal. The word of laying the cable will be immediately commenced by the Dacha and Suffolk. During an engagement lately near Moron, between the Spanlards and insurgents, Lieutenant Patino, of

the Spanish army, and eighteen soldiers were killed. Colonel Seventien insurgents were also killed. Colonel Noval also attacked this same body of insurgents on the 'th Inst., killing thirty-one of their number. Great excitement exists throughout the island over the European complications. The schooner Neily Taibot was towed into this

port to-day dismasted.
