cipo jurasliction again on the 27th uit. The loysi guerillas started in pursuit and led to his camp by a rebel prisoner, a sharp fight ensued lasting an hour and a haif. Bembeta, after reforming his line three times, was finally routed. Sixteen Spaniards and forty six Cubans were killed. Bembeta's force numbered six hundred.

The commanding officer in the Holguin district reports that he has captured the seven remaining

men of the second George B. Upton expedition, and that they are now in juil at 10 followin. He also states that the rebel Colonel Lous, who commanded the militudiers, was killed by a corporal and two soldiers, after a desperate resistance, during which the corporal was badly wounded.
