THE LATEST CUBAN News furnished us by our special correspondent in Cuba shows very plainly the light in which the Spanish planters there regard the institution of slavery. The opposition to any scheme looking forward to emancipation will be both active and determined. It matters little whether the Spanish Cortes decides that the abolition of slavery is a necessity or not, the Spanish slaveholders on the island will have their way in the matter, and they will carry the day. The island at the present moment is more effectually in the hands of the volunteers, who are controlled by the slaveholders, than under the rule of Spain. The Captain General has for months past absented himself from Havana, and if the truth was known we think it could be shown that his absence is due to the hostility of those who are opposed to his administration of affairs. Our correspondent puts the subject of Spanish opposition to emancipation very fairly before the readers of the HERALD,
