Surrender of Marmol—Probabilities of his Execution.

HAVANA, June 18.—The insurgent Gen. EDWARDO MARMOL. who at the beginning of the revolution raised a band of four hundred negroes in the jurisdiction of Guantanamo, offered to surrender to Gen. PALANCA, at Santiago de Cuba. Gen. Palanca refused to accept his surrender unless Marmol brought a certain. number of insurgents with him, which the Spanish Government demands as a condition for the. pardon of an officer of bis rank. Marmol thereupon went to Ciego de Avila, accompanied by a friend, and surrendered to the Spanish commander. As he came without the prescribed number of men, he will probably be shot.
