

Slain Cuba Editor's Paper Suspended On Judicial Order

Government Confiscates *El Dia* Edition Because Of Cartoon Cabinet Member Finds Offensive.

El Heraldo, Against Which Libel Suit Has Been Filed, Still Off Streets—Menocal At Alvarado Funeral.

Havana, Aug. 21 (AP).—On complaint of the Secretary of Sanitation, Daniel Gispert, today's edition of the newspaper *El Dia* was taken from newsboys and other venders, the police acting under court orders. The paper has suspended publication.

Gispert objected to a cartoon in the issue. Libel suit was filed against *El Dia* yesterday in the name of President Machado, based on an article headed "Coward."

El Heraldo, against which Secretary Gispert filed a libel suit several days ago, has not resumed publication.

On Judicial Authority.

Secretary of Justice J. M. Barraque said confiscation of all copies of *El Dia* and *El Heraldo* on the streets yesterday had been ordered by the judicial authorities. Many copies of *El Dia*'s edition were seized.

The body of Armando Andre Alvarado, publisher of *El Dia*, who was assassinated yesterday, was buried today. Many political friends, headed by former President Menocal, attend the funeral.

The authorities' offer to pay the slain revolutionary veteran, full military honors was declined by the widow.
