

HAVANA PUBLISHER IS ASSASSINATED

**Senor Andre y Alvarado, Of El
Dia, Fatally Shot In Street;
Had Attacked Government**

HAVANA, Cuba, Aug. 20 (AP)—Armando Andre y Alvarado, 62-year publisher of the newspaper El Dia and former Havana port police captain, was shot by two men as he left his automobile in front of his home on Concordia street early this morning and died a short time later at a local hospital.

The assailants, said to be a negro and a white man, both opened fire with revolvers without warning, six bullets striking the publisher.

El Dia, an opposition paper, was founded by Senor Andre when he left the port police last May.

At the interior department no statement could be obtained in connection with the confiscation of yesterday afternoon's editions of El Dia and El Herald. Police collecting the papers on the streets said they were acting on orders from the interior department.

Both papers lately have bitterly attacked the government.
