

Funk's Hatchery Sending Chicks To Cuba By Air

A. G. Abreu, Latin American representative of Funk's Hatchery, this week began shipment of day-old Funk's Pullorum Controlled New Hampshire chicks by Air Express to Havana, Cuba.

Mr. Abreu, who lives near NH Route, west of De Soto, was formerly the Cuban consul in St. Louis.

He made a round trip to Cuba by air last week and completed arrangements while there to begin shipment of Funk's quality chicks.

Chicks which came out of the incubator Tuesday morning went to St. Louis by Railway Express the same afternoon, were placed aboard a plane in St. Louis at 3:30 o'clock the next morning and arrived in Havana in the hands of the buyer before noon.

For some time, George Olson, manager of Funk's Hatchery, and Mr. Abreu have been working toward this goal.

It has been found more economical to hatch the chicks here and fly them to Cuba than to ship the eggs and have them incubated there.

With one-day delivery by air, chicks can be hatched here and arrive in Cuba before it is advisable to feed them, removing the necessity of feeding and watering while in transit.

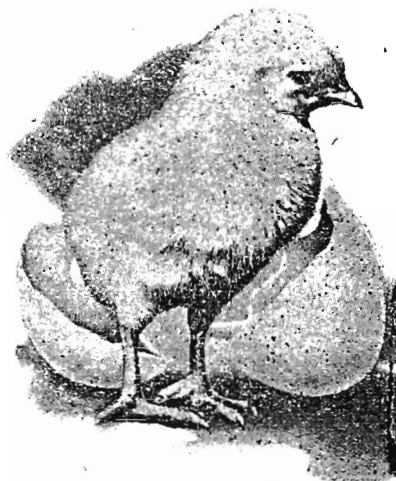

Dear Sr. Font:

Thank you for your letter of April 23. We regret very much that we cannot furnish you with the cockerels you ordered, since we do not have the straight cockerels at all. We do not do any sexing. All chicks are sold straight run, pullets and cockerels mixed. Since we are unable to furnish the chicks you ordered, we are returning your money orders in the amounts of \$23.00 and \$49.03.

If you find that you will be able to use the straight run chicks, we can ship these on May 6 or May 13 likely, providing we receive your order by return mail and money orders totaling \$76.03.

We regret indeed that you and Mr. Casada have experienced what you refer to as cripples. We presume you mean by this that some of the chicks have a leg weakness and cannot walk properly. Off hand, we suppose this must be Ricketts, a weakness of the legs due to the lack of sunshine or Vitamin D. You can readily correct this condition by mixing one pint of Cod Liver Oil (regular strength) in 100 pounds of your mash, and feeding all the chicks will eat for two weeks. For individual cases, you may treat by giving six drops of Cod Liver Oil to each chick once a day for one week. You may use a regular medicine dropper for this and just drop the drops well back on the tongue of the chick. Please let us know more about your chicks after this treatment has been given for the prescribed length of time.

In regard to the matter of replacing chicks, Mr. Abreu is in direct and complete charge of all Latin American sales. You may address all orders and correspondence direct to him. Trusting this clarifies the situation and hoping we may be of further service to you, we remain







We regret very much that we do not have a Spanish translator on our staff at present, so are just venturing the following information in the hopes it may be helpful to you.

We hatch the New Hampshire breed of baby chicks almost entirely. We have had fine success flying these chicks to Havana on the few occasions we have shipped chicks to Cuba. We make excellent connections with the airport at St. Louis, getting the chicks to Havana in 24 to 48 hours.

On quantity orders we can get the chicks to St. Louis @ \$13.75 per 100 and would add the shipping charges from there, since such charges vary considerably with the size order. Chicks must clear through your consul in St. Louis and usually there are some import duties.

Since all livestock must be prepaid from point of origin it would be necessary for you to arrange prepayment.

If you have further questions and will write us in English, we shall do our best to answer and be of assistance in any way we can.

Production

In addition to the fundamental practices of good poultry management, there are few projects that will assist poultry raisers to maintain better average egg production, and use of labor and equipment more than a well reared, carefully selected flock of fall hatched pullets.

As the main flock is culled down during the winter months on the average poultry farm, several pens are usually available for fall hatched birds which would otherwise remain empty during the summer months.

The success of the entire fall pullet program depends upon careful selection at housing time. Only the healthy, fully-fleshed bright-combed, well pigmented birds should be kept for layers. It is poor policy to house pullets that show defects or are not vigorous and healthy, hoping to improve them with good care. Throw out the potential culls; they are never worth keeping.

After the pullets have laid during the summer and show signs of going into their fall molt, **THE ENTIRE FLOCK SHOULD BE MARKETING**, as it does not pay to feed them for a second period of laying.

With good laying stock carefully housed and good management coupled with a sensible feeding program, those fall hatched pullets should show an excellent egg profit during the summer months, and help to hold your customers through a normally slack season.

PULLET AND HEN EGG YIELDS COMPARED

The average annual egg production of pullets entered in the Maryland farm flock record from 1929 to 1941 was 168 eggs, compared with 133 for hens, according to Morley A. Jull, University of Maryland, in Maryland Extension Bulletin 111.

Stray pigeons are known to be carriers of Pullorum Disease.

Eggs are second among the three items listed in America's preferred diet by H. E. Babcock in the Cooperative Digest. They outrank meat but are not quite up to milk.

QUICK FROZEN POULTRY

The growth of the quick-frozen poultry business has kept pace with progress in freezing other foods since 1935. In fact, the rate of increase in poultry has been greater than any other important food item.

In 1935, there were only five million pounds of poultry quick-frozen. By 1945, this figure had increased to 108 million pounds.

"Higher cost of operation and increased competition from other foods can be met only by greater efficiency and with better stock. The poultry business will remain profitable, but only for those who are successful in securing a higher level of results than formerly was necessary.
