\*This company was finally paroled as (2d) Company B, Manigault's Battalion, South Carolina Artillery.

Manigault's Battalion South Carolina Artillery was organized with three companies, A, B and (1st) C, by S. O. No. 242, Hdqrs. Dept. S. C., Ga. and Fla., dated December 4, 1862. (1st) Company C was exchanged for Captain Zimmerman's Company, South Carolina Artillery, by S. O. No. 105, A. & I. G. O., dated May 5, 1864. Company D was organized about February 14, 1864, by S.O. No. 12, Hdqrs. Siege Train, and was composed of Louisianians transferred from Companies A and B of this battalion. The battalion was also designated at various times as Alston's Battalion, South Carolina Artillery; 18th Battalion, South Carolina Artillery; and the South Carolina Siege Train.
