On 1/7/75, ANTONIO de la COVA, 311 S.W. 31st Avenue, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, telephone number 587-4176, said he is a graduate student at Florida Atlantic University, Boca Raton, Fla.

b7C DE LA COVA appeared at the Miami FBI Office because he is being accused by the Boca Raton Police Department, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]. DE LA COVA explained that there are some students at FAU who favor the CASTRO regime in Cuba. This group publishes a magazine "AREITO" which comes out every three months. The two leaders of this group are ELIVIO SERRANO, age about 26, and ROSA GIL, age about 27. GIL lives at 2499 N.E. 2nd Avenue, Boca Raton. In order to penetrate this group, DE LA COVA has been quite friendly with GIL. On numerous occasions he has visited GIL at her home where she has six file draws full of pamphlets and magazines which are favorable to the CASTRO regime in Cuba.

b7C, b7D On 12/15/74, a burglary was committed at GIL's home, and all the documents were taken, [REDACTED]

DE LA COVA said the Boca Raton Police Department has questioned him about this burglary and wants him to take a lie-detector test.

ON 11/27/75, [REDACTED] UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI, SECURITY DIVISION, CORAL GABLES, FLA., ADVISED THAT THE PIPE BOMB WAS LOCATED NEXT TO APARTMENT OF ELISEO PEREZ-STABLE, 1243 DICKINSON ST., APT. 15Q, A STUDENT DORMITORY BUILDING ON THE UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI CAMPUS. PEREZ IS A MEDICAL STUDENT AND A WRITER FOR AREITO, A SPANISH MAGAZINE WHICH LEANS TO THE LEFT OF THE POLITICAL SPECTRUM. PEREZ HAS WRITTEN ARTICLES ADVOCATING THE LIFTING OF SANCTIONS BY UNITED STATES AGAINST CUBA.

ON OUTSIDE WALL OF PEREZ'S APARTMENT, THE INITIALS UCA OR "UCA" WERE FOUND. [REDACTED] ADVISED THAT IT IS NOT KNOWN AT THIS TIME WHAT THE LETTERS STAND FOR.

IT APPEARS THAT THIS PIPE BOMB MAY HAVE BEEN PLACED AT PEREZ'S APARTMENT BY AN ANTI-CASTRO ORGANIZATION. IN VIEW OF ABOVE INFO, MIAMI WILL ASSUME JURISDICTION AND CONDUCT APPROPRIATE INVESTIGATION.

ELISEO PEREZ-STABLE was interviewed at his father's residence, 10352 S.W. 113th Street, Miami, Florida, by Special Agents (SAs) BILL J. WINDLAND and GEORGE R. KISZYNSKI.

PEREZ advised that he and his wife, LILIANA BLANCO, reside at 1243 Dickinson Road, Apartment 15Q, a student dormitory building on the University of Miami campus. During the evening of November 27, 1975, he and his wife were at home entertaining friends. His guests left at approximately 11:30 P.M. At that time they failed to notice anything unusual. On November 28, 1975, PEREZ walked outside at approximately 8:30 A.M., and noticed a pipe with a cable attached to it. On the wall he noticed the letters UCA. After noticing the bomb, PEREZ telephoned a friend and ten minutes later, he contacted the University of Miami Security Division which responded to the call.

PEREZ stated that he is a staff member of "AREITO", a Spanish magazine which has taken a stand in favor of peaceful coexistence with FIDEL CASTRO. PEREZ contended that he does not know who may have placed the bomb in front of his apartment's door, but stated that approximately ~~one~~ year ago, he had a political discussion with ~~LEONARDO VIOTA~~, who is a Cuban exile who is adamantly against FIDEL CASTRO and his communist regime.

On November 28, 1975, MARIA PEREZ-STABLE, who resides at 1120 S.W. 1st Avenue, Gainesville, Florida, was interviewed by Special Agents (SAs) BILL J. WINDLAND and GEORGE R. KISZYNSKI of the FBI at her father's residence, 10352 S.W. 113th Street, Miami, Florida.

Miss PEREZ stated that she returned to Miami after having found out that a pipe bomb had been found in front of her brother's residence at 1243 Dickinson Road, Apartment 15Q. She advised that she does not know who is responsible for placing the bomb, but she feels that her brother has made many political enemies in the Cuban exile community because he occasionally writes for "Areito", which is a magazine written in Spanish, whose editorial board has taken an stand in favor of peaceful coexistence between the United States and Cuba.

Miss PEREZ advised that she is not certain whether other people of the editorial board of "Areito" have been threatened in the past, but stated that some of them may have information which would assist the FBI in this investigation. The members of the editorial board of "Areito" are:

On December 2, 1975, [REDACTED] Veteran's Administration Hospital, Miami, Florida, 10552 S. W. 113th Street, Miami, Florida, advised that he was concerned for the safety of [REDACTED] who was the victim of a bombing attempt and [REDACTED] as a result of their activities in connection with the [REDACTED]. They have recently become the target of criticism at the hands of anti-CASTRO Cuban exiles in the Miami area. He stated that the [REDACTED] family have always been counter-revolutionary in their support and sympathies and he does not know where [REDACTED] developed her political philosophy and enthusiasm. She had always attended Catholic schools and her educational home training had certainly in no way contributed to her current political thinking. He was at a loss to explain her interest, but pointed out that she was well educated and had traveled considerably. b7c b7D

Following her early days at the University of Florida in Gainesville, she had spent a year or two working in Puerto Rico and recently during the winter of 1974 and 1975, she made a visit to Cuba. She has strongly encouraged the political thinking of her brother [REDACTED] and he has joined her in her various activities and on the staff of [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] HIS SON ELI [REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] has probably made enemies in the Miami area because of his political views but does not know of anyone who would place a bomb in front of his apartment. b7c b7D

PEREZ-STABLE is well known in the Miami area and has contributed articles to this magazine. He has also travelled to Cuba and upon his return to the United States, has shown slides depicting Cuban life and culture. He has made political enemies in the Miami area and consequently, a pipe bomb was placed in front of his apartment at the University of Miami.

[REDACTED] does not know who placed the pipe bomb, but he is certain that it was done because PEREZ-STABLE's political views.

**COMPONENTS OF UNEXPLODED PIPE BOMB FOUND AT 1243 DICKINSON
ROAD, APARTMENT 15Q, UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI, CORAL GABLES:**

- Q1 Length of burned safety fuse with fuse lighter
attached (1)**
- Q2 Pipe nipple with two end caps attached (2)**
- Q3 Non-electric blasting cap (3)**
- Q4 Sample of powder and debris (4)**

Result of examination:

The remaining observable physical characteristics of the piece of burned safety fuse in specimen Q1 are like "Clover Brand-Black Wax Finish" safety fuse, formerly manufactured by the Ensign Bickford Company, with main offices in Simsbury, Connecticut; and "Black Aztec" safety fuse, formerly manufactured by the National Fuse and Powder Company, Denver, Colorado. The burned condition of the fuse precludes a more definite determination of the specific brand.

According to information available in the Laboratory, "Clover Brand" safety fuse has not been manufactured by the Ensign Bickford Company since early 1972. Additionally, the National Fuse and Powder Company went out of business in June, 1964.

The fuse lighter attached to one end of the fuse is a "Pull Wire Fuse Lighter" manufactured by the Martin and Shaft Company, Denver, Colorado.

The pipe nipple in specimen Q2 is 1 1/2" standard weight pipe, 8" long. The two pipe end caps on the nipple bear the raised molded letter "U." This is probably the marking of U-Brand Corporation, Ashland, Ohio. One of the end caps exhibits a drilled hole, approximately 17/64" in size. This hole will accommodate the safety fuse in Q1.

Gripping-type toolmarks typical of those produced by a tool such as a pipe threading vise are present on the pipe nipple. Marks on this nipple, and on the nipples in specimens Q2, Q3 and Q4, which were submitted in the case captioned "MIBOM, EID, 12/3/75, OO: MIAMI" (Miami file 174-940, Bureau file 174-6570) were identified as having been produced by the same tool.

The Q3 non-electric blasting cap was identified as a No. 6 size fuse cap manufactured by Atlas.

Perforated disc and flattened ball type smokeless powders are present in specimen Q4. Several of the discs noted in the powder were yellow in color. Several others were red in color. These are typical of "Dupont 700-X" and "Hercules Red Dot" smokeless powders, respectively.

Mr. and Mrs. VICENTE DOPICO were interviewed by SA GEORGE R. KISZYNSKI of the FBI who identified himself.

Mr. and Mrs. DOPICO advised that during the evening of April 16, 1976, and early morning hours of April 17, 1976, they were studying for their final examinations when they heard a motorcycle pass their residence two or three times. At approximately 1:30 AM they heard two objects strike the rear section of their home. There was no explosion or fire. Immediately after the objects were thrown against the residence, Mr. and Mrs. DOPICO heard a motorcycle leave from the rear section of the lot.

The motorcycle once again passed in front of the residence and Mrs. DOPICO was able to see an individual dressed in dark clothing and a dark helmet. She stated that she could not furnish any other information regarding the individual driving the motorcycle. She was also unable to furnish any information regarding the type of motorcycle used since it was quite dark and the vehicle passed the residence at a high rate of speed.

[REDACTED] stated that at approximately 11:30 a.m., April 29, 1976, when he was leaving the medical school, he noticed that a faded 1965 gray Volkswagen was following him and his companion, ALBERTO DE ARMENDI, who was driving a royal blue 1974 Gremlin.

The Volkswagen followed them on to the highway and continued to follow them until they exited at Miami Avenue in downtown Miami. [REDACTED] said that there was no question that the gray Volkswagen was following him and his companion. b7c

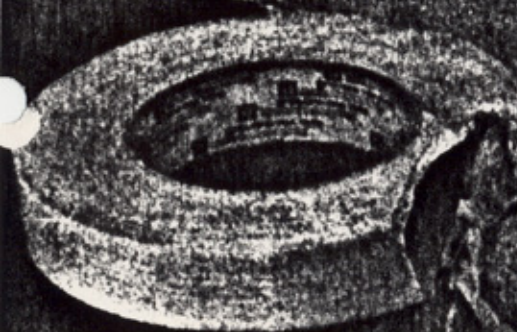
