"Citizen Clinton Up Close," Apr. 8, 2002 Newsweek

Dear Mr. Ortega:

On June 12, 2002, your firm asked Newsweek to publish a clarification of its April 8 2002, article "Citizen Clinton Close Up." On June 27, 2002, I responded to that request on behalf of Newsweek proposing publication of a clarification in the edition of Newsweek to be distributed on Monday, July 1, 2002. Since making that proposal, we had no further communication from your firm until your letter of October 22, 2002.

Newsweek remains willing to publish a clarification of the April 8, 2002, article. In light of the passage of time both from the date of publication and the events at issue, Newsweek proposes to do so through publication of your letter in its Letters section, edited and headlined as follows:

Bosch: "Correct the Record"

We are writing about inaccurate statements in "Citizen Clinton Close Up" (NATION, April 8) to correct the record. Our client, Orlando Bosch, was acquitted three times in Venezuela; first by military, then by criminal, and finally by civil tribunal of the bombing of the Cubana airliner in 1976. He was not "freed from jail" by then President Bush "under pressure from his son Jeb and Cuban exiles." Rather, after being freed from Venezuela and attempting to enter the United States, Mr. Bosch was detained as an excludable alien and was not allowed to enter the United States. After spending two years in a federal prison, the United States government finally allowed him to "enter" the United States.
