"Gen Gillmore was undoubtedly forced into the assault upon Fort Wagner against his better judg. ment I have great confidence in him, and think from the way he is going to work now shar Charlesion will certainly fall. It will be slow but sure. He has set all the negro soldiers at favigue work, which is what every other General ought to do. The stories about their aplendid fighting are. Tall in my eye. At the ateault they ran away as fact as they could, and come near demoralizing the whole attacking force. In an bour after the fight commenced over a thousand of them came strageling down to the South and of the Island. and before morning there were at the hospital and dock over three hundred of them, not hurt in the least. There were not a dozen white soldiers at the dock. I noo the New York papers give them credit for coing wonders don't you believe it."
