## THE SEIZURE OF TA'E GEORGE CROMWELL.

NAMES OF PARTIES ARRESTED.

## An Ex-Minister from San Salvade, and His Wife Among the Number.

The account of the Engineer of the New-Orleans steamer Geo. Cromwell, on Thursday last, and the arrest of several parties implicated in the contraband trade with the rebels, has already been published. The names of the parties arrested and the anecific charges against them have been withheld by the Government authorities until yesterday, when it was announced that among them were Hon. H. SEGUR. formerly Minister to the United States from the Government of San Salvador, and his wife and maidservant. Also, Mr. G. F. CAUTY, a merchant of this City, and Mr. D. PEREZ, of San Salvador. Mr. SEQUE and Mr. PEREZ were arrested on board the Geo. Cromwell, where they had embarked for New-Orleans. Mr. CAUTY was not going out in the steamer, but was discovered to be intimate with the suspected parties. and was arrested as he was about bidding them : adieu. On the reison of Mrs. Secue was found a blif of lading for fifty kegs of lard, which had been ship-ped on board the British bark Circassian. On Friday the kegs of laid were seized, and in them were found one thousand navy revolvers. In the personal baggage of Mr. SEGUE and Mr. PEREZ were also found revolvers and rifle and pistol cartridges. In the bosom of Mrs. Shous and of her maid-servant were also found revolvers, and even the children belonging to the family had the same articles concealed about their clothing. The parties were all taken to For Lafayettee on Sunday. Several other parties, including the firm in Cortlandt-street, at whose house the barrels containing powder were packed which were seized on the Geo. Cromwell, have also been arrested, but their names are withheld for the present.
