DEMOCRATS of the Twelfth Ward will do well to scrutinize their ballots, and see that they vote for the regular Democratic candidates for Alderman and Councilman. Wr. Holmes is the nomince for Alderman, and at the primary nomination received ten times as many votes as W. C. Hipp, who opposed him. Mr. Hipp had been Councilman for two years, but was a man of no force or influence whatever in Council, and, on that account, was defeated for Alderman at the I rimary meetings. He has now announced himself as an independent candidate, with the simple avowed purpose of defeating Mr. Holmes. The estizens of the Twelfth Ward can make no Letter selection for Alderman than Mr. Holmes, and he

ought to be elected by a large majority.
