Modern Life's Toll: Stress and Tensions

ST. LOUIS, March 27 Stresses and tensions of modern life have made some men women sterile, Dr. Robert N. Creadick of Duke University said today.

Emotions and atress can affect body hormones and nerves with consequent effects on fertility, he told the American Academy General Practice

Study of psychological factors in sterility has been a major part of newest scientific efforts to help such couples, Dr. Creadick said

Sterility is most times due to physical causes, some of which can be detected and corrected. In about 30 per cent or cases, failure to have children is due to lack of fertility in the husband.

Emotional stresses apparently act through a vita! brain center, the hypothalamus, the physician explained. "Both in man and in animals
