According to police report victim was found by a co-worker shot and slumped over his desk at place of business, with apparent gunshot wound of head. FRU was called and determined at the scene that victim had a weak pulse. Victim was transported to Miami Dade General Hospital. Pulse was a bit stronger upon arrival at E/R, where victim was admitted at 10:15 AM and pronounced at 10:30 AM X-Rays revealed negative projectile. Location: Piranha Boat Company, 9970 Banyan Street, Perrine, Florida. Funeral Director: Rivero.

IDENTIFICATION:

The body is identified on April 13, 1976, at 4:10 PM by Julio Ojeda, professional - PSD Homicide Det.,

EXTERNAL EXAMINATION:

This is the body of a well developed, well nourished, white male appearing to be in his fifth decade of life with a height of 5 feet 9 inches and a wieght of 200 pounds.

There is black straight hair with graying over the head without significant balding. The irides are brown. The pupils are equally dilated. No petechiae or scleral injection is noted. The natural teeth are in good repair. The chest is normally symmetric. The abdomen is flat without scars or striae and the genitalia are those of a circumcised male with bilaterally descended testicles. The only trauma to the body noted with the exception of the gunshot wound is an area of abrasion without contusion over primarily the left side and midline of the forehead and over the eyebrows.

GUNSHOT WOUND:

There is a gunshot wound of the head. It is associated with a wound of entrance located 2-3/4 of an inch above and 2 inches behind the left ear. The wound is within the hair and when the hair is shaved the wound is noted to be perfectly circular with a small rim of abrasion. The wound measures 3/8 of an inch in diameter. It has a slight gray ring. No evidence of powder stippling or smoke deposition can be found. Associated with the wound is a tract which extends through the posterior portion of the temporalis muscle, through the squamous temporal bone with beveling inward, through the left occipital cortex, through the superior pons, through the right temporal cortex with exiting through the right squamous temporal bone in its anterior portion and then exiting from the skin from an irregular minimally jagged exit wound without abrasion located 1 inch above and 2 inches in front of the right external auditory canal. The missile proceeded primarily from left to right, slightly forward and slightly downward. X-ray examination and physical examination fails to reveal the presence of any missile fragment within the tract of the wound.

According to a gun expert, clean wound was made by high-power rifle, most likely a 30-6, with a soft-point bullet.
