New Minister of Communications

Following the announcement yesterday that Autentico dinister of Communications Carlos MARISTAWY would be replaced by a Aepublican (Embassy's A-696, May 25), it was learned last night that the new Minister would be Senor Arturo ILVAS Cuza, Republican Representative from Oriente and a faithful henchman of Vice President ALONSO Pujol. Señor Haristany, who has been recently criticized because of his repressive measures against certain radio stations (Embassy's A-687, Tay 19), will resume his former position as Under-Secretary of Communications.

Although only 32 years of age, Senor Thias has been prominent in politics for the past ten years. In 1940, when only twenty-three, he was elected Republican Representation tive from Oriente and became the youngest member of the House. In 1942, while still a Representative, he was are pointed Collector of Customs in Jantiago and in 1948 was reelected to the House. A founder of the Republican Farty, Jenor Illas was that party's first leader in the flouse. He is now deputy leader of the House Republican Farliamentary Committee. The new Ednister has taken a keen interest in sports as an oarsman, marksman and fencer. He owns an extensive cattle ranch in Uriente.

Although it is to be expected that Illas will take orders from the Vice President, it will be interesting to observe whether he will over-shadow Laristany in The actual running of the Ministry of Communications.
