Received a call from L. Sexton, Road Patrolman requesting someone contact him at his house, reference to Cuban in neighborhood.

Arrived at Sexton's residence, 570 N. W. 34 St. at approximately 1:30 P.M. July 3, 1958. Sexton stated that two doors east of his house at 548 N. W. 34 St., there has been an excessive amount of activity involving a Cuban recently moving into the two story multiple dwelling located there. The building, located at 548 N. W. 35 St. sits back approximately 100 yards from the sidewalk, and Sexton pointed out that on normal visitations the cars are parked near the street, however, two or three times a week, usually after 8:00 P.M. a group of five or six cars pull into the lot and park in close to the house. On these occasions there is much talking and hollaring (in Cuban) by the males.

Approximately six weeks ago, Sexton noticed an 18 to 20 foot cabin cruiser boat on a trailer parked near the building (548 N. W. 34 St.) The boat had one inboard engine, and various male occupants of the house were engaged in minor repairs on the boat. The boat was fitted with what Sexton believed to be two thirtyfive horsepower outboards, then within a week two males placed a Broward County tag on the boat trailer and removed both the boat and trailer.

Obtained consent of one occupant in 558 N. W. 34 St. to use his apartment in reference to a surveillence. His apartment is on the direct side of 548 N. W. 34 St.

At the time of this interview with Sexton, only one car parked in front of 548 N. W. 34 St. This was a '49 Cheverolet bearing a '58 Florida 1-123219 license tag. A check of this tag number disclosed the car is registered to Delilah Echevarria, 548 N. W. 34 St. Subject: Q.R.U. in our records.
