SUBJECT: MARIO MURARA

On June 26,6 1958 information received by this office that a MARIO MURARA, allegedly living at 1451 S. W. 6th St., was involved in illegal arms traffic in favor of the rebel Cuban faction.

An investigation of the location by the writer and agents McKee and Kappel, at about 3:30 P.M. of the same date disclosed that there were no people in the house at the moment. It was noted that there were two exits to the backyard and driveway to the East of the house of an approximate length of 60 feet. A gray '49 Cheverolet belonging to Lucille Lindsey of 1523 N.W. 38 St. 1-30287 57 Florida license was parked in front.

Further investigation at about 8:50 P.M. of the same night disclosed that there were at least two families living in the house. One apparently American, the other definitely of Latin origin, living on the West side of the house. At the time of the investigation, two Latin males accompanied by a child came out of the house and made a phone call at a booth located on the opposite sidewalk, fact that suggests that the house has no phone as no telephone wires were observed. No other activity was noted at the time. There was a '55 four-door Pontiac belonging to Leslie Paller of 2375 S. W. 9th St. 1W 111557 58 Florida license parked in the driveway.

The writer investigated the location at different hours and noted that during the day the house remains empty, and there are no cars parked in the driveway. During the day hours, the 49 gray Cheverolet remains parked in front of the house. No other activity was observed.

This information will be given to Detective Billbrough for his files.
