SUBJECT: POSSIBLE STORING OF ARMS

At approximately 11:25 AM 7/6/59, KAPPEL received a phone call from Mrs. BUSH stating a Mr. MIKE BONAFORTE, 4625 N.W. 15th Avenue, NE 5-3324 had just phoned the Sheriff with information reference a possible arms cache.

At approximately 11:50 AM, KAPPEL and Sergeant JACK TUCKFIELD arrived at 4625 N.W. 15th Avenue and contacted Mr. BONAFORTE.

Mr. BONAFORTE stated approximately one month ago some "Spics" moved into the front apartment of a duplex located at 4660 N.W. 15th Avenue directly across from his (BONAFORTE'S) residence, and that there are people moving "boxes" into the apartment during the early morning hours. BONAFORTE further stated just prior to our arrival, a large tractor-trailer truck had been parked in front of 4620 for approximately one hour.

At approximately 12:10 PM, 7/6/59, KAPPEL and Sergeant TUCKFIELD went to 4620 N.W. 15th Avenue. A W/F, with an infant in her arms answered the door. After identifying ourselves, KAPPEL proceeded to explain the Department's receiving the complaint and would she object to our looking into the apartment. The W/F invited us into the apartment and introduced her husband HENRI AUBIN who was seated at the kitchen table accompanied by another W/M and W/F.

The reason for our presence was explained to MR. AUBIN who granted us permission to "look around", which was done with negative results. Mr. AUBIN also stated that they were musicians and carried their instruments into the apartment in the early A.M. after playing engagements.

It may be noted at this time these people were definitely not of latin-American decent and spoke with polish accents.

We were informed by the other W/M present in AUBIN'S apartment that the truck driver (reference aforementioned tractor trailer) was visiting a lady in the rear apartment.

No further investigation necessary. This case is considered closed.
