

26 June 1958.

Investigation into Cuban Revolutionary activities.

1. At 9:10 am on June 26, 1958, I received a call from Agent Wallace Shanley, U. S. Customs Service, stating that at 8:29 am on the same date, a transfer of rifles was reported by a citizen in front of 4231 NW 1 St. Complainant, a Mr. Michael of this address apt. 1, stated that the driver of a old Studebaker bearing license number 1-126671 removed the weapons from the trunk of his car and placed them in a Cadillac sedan bearing license 1W11163.
2. Accompanied by Det. L. F. Gracy of Miami PD, we went to scene and observed the Studebaker parked at the curb, apparently empty. We went to the Tamiami Airport and examined all vehicles and hangers for the Cadillac; negative results. We returned to 4231 NW 1 St. and staked out the car for several hours but no one appeared.
3. License 1-126671 checks out to a 1947 Studebaker four door sedan and tag was issued to Merral Carpenter, 225 E. 42 St., Hia. License 1W11163 checks out to a 1950 Cadillac two door sedan and tag was issued to Armondo Rodriguez, 252 S.W. 8th St., Miami.
4. Det. Hebert, PMD, was notified of this information and is checking out vehicle owners for further info.
