In June, 1955, eighty-five Youth Ambassadors, teen agers from Jefferson County, Kentucky, visited Cuba on a mission of good will and friendship.

They were received in Cuba enthusiastically, hospitably and in a spirit reflecting the purpose of their mission.

Received by President Fulgencio Batista they were accorded official welcome and were presented with a bronze bust of the "Apostle" Jose Marti, one of the great figures in the struggle for independence in the Americas.

It is the hope of the Youth Ambassadors that the placing of this gift in Shively Park will generate a new interest in Cuba, in the history of that island and respect for the character of the nation that produced Jose Marti.

This is probably the first instance of a gift of this kind from a nation to a county unit of our own country. It was accepted in the name of all the children of the United States and will stand as a constant reminder of our kinship to peoples of our neighboring countries.
