

**Democratic Meeting.**

A large and enthusiastic meeting of the Democracy—the largest ever held in the country—was held at Kickapoo on Thursday last. Judge Jno. FREELAND as President, and Wm. H. Elliott, as Secretary.

Capt. J. W. Martin, W. Mathias, Lewis Burnes, and Judge Freeland addressed the meeting. The following Resolutions were unanimously adopted:

Resolved: That the conduct of the acting Gov. of Kansas Territory (Stanton) in issuing a proclamation calling an extraordinary meeting of the Legislature of said Territory to assemble on the 7th inst. at Lecompton was uncalled for, unnecessary and illegal and meets with the repudiation and reprobation of this meeting; that the delegates "elect" have no legal right to assemble and act in the capacity of legislators until the 1st Monday of January next, that no act of theirs, as such legislators can be legal before that time; that we look upon the whole movement as a high handed outrage, justly deserving the execration of all honest men.

Resolved: That the acting Governor in succumbing to the secret machinations of the various cliques, agents, and tools of the Black Republicans of Kansas, by rendering them "aid and comfort" and warming them into life, after they have been so signally repudiated and rebuked throughout the country in the recent elections proves himself to be a renegade from the Democratic party and a traitor to the country.
