

U. S. DISTRICT COURT—*Tuesday*.—Before Judge BETTS.—No Grand or Petit Jurors were in attendance for the April Term, Mr. Hall, U. S. District Attorney, not intending to try any civil causes, as the Court has a heavy Admiralty calendar to attend to.

*In re Louis Schlessinger*.—Mr. Dillon, on the part of Charles O'Connor, to move an affidavit, that inasmuch as Schlessinger was condemned to be imprisoned for ten years in Spain, and was therefore beyond the reach of his surety, and also of any process of the United States, that Charles O'Connor should be liberated from the sureties he had entered into, and the order for the forfeiture discharged. Mr. Dillon cited several authorities in support of the motion.

Mr. Hall said he did not mean to oppose the motion, as he knew the facts to be as stated by the gentleman, and also that the law was as cited in support of the motion.

The Court directed the Clerk to make the necessary entry on the minutes.
