William Walker in New-Orleans. New-Orleans, Monday, Feb. 1, 1838. M. William Walker appeared before the United States District Court thus morning, when Judge McCaleb said there was nothing against him, the Grand Jury having refused to find a bill against him.

Walker then asked to be put on trial for violation of the Neutrality laws, which the Judge refused, as the District-Attorney said there was nothing against him, unless new instructions were received from Weshington.

On Sunday morning a large file occurred, consuming the Margaine-Street Market and some adjacent stores,

and causing a loss of over \$50,000.

Another fire took place this morning in Canal street.
