JONESBORO', TENNESSEE,
Washington County, Oct. 20, 1848.

In Tennessee we are wide awake. In this county, on the 17th and 18th, we had a large mass meeting at Fall Branch, largely attended. The citizens encamped on the ground. We had flags, music, and eighty beautiful transparencies. The meeting was addressed on the two days by the Hon. Andrew Johnson, Landon C. Haynes, the elector for this district, Hon. Brookins Campbell, Doct. A. Martin, and M. J. Bunch. This last named gentleman is the son of the Hon. Samuel Bunch, who is a whig, and was in Congress, from East Tennessee, several years ago. M. J. Bunch is a young gentleman who started in life a whig, as it was natural for him to do, his father being one. When the war began with Mexico, young Bunch volunteered and went into the army of Gen. Taylor; was in the battle of Buena Vista, and afterwards joined Gen. Scott; was in all his battles, and continued in the army until peace was made. This gentleman has returned to the United States a sound Cass and Butler democrat, and made one of the finest speeches in favor of them I ever listened to. He is making speeches all over East Tennessee, and will continue to do so until the day of the election. His course will thin the whig ranks wherever he goes. "All is well."
