ment of delegates to meet at the city of Washington, to represent all the Grand Lodges in the United States, which was referred to a select committee composed of Brothers TANNEHILL, TARPLEY, and FIELD.

The following report was received and concurred in:

The committee to whom was referred the question, "Has the Master of a subordinate Lodge the right to suspend its operations and take away its Charter without the consent of the Lodge, except so far as to adjourn from one Stated Meeting to another?" beg leave to report that they have given the subject that deliberation which its importance to the Craft merits. They have examined the ancient Constitutions of the Order which Masons have universally acknowledged, and find no such power, either granted or implied. They have also reflected upon the effects which the affirmative of the proposition might have upon the interests of Masonry and the rights of Lodges. They are of opinion that the power to suspend the working of a Lodge is vested in the Grand Master during the recess of the Grand Lodge, which suspension may extend to the next ensuing meeting of the Grand Lodge, and that the power to arrest or recall the Charter of a Lodge belongs exclusively to the Grand Lodge. They are clearly of opinion that there is no such power in the Master of a subordinate Lodge, derived either from the ancient Constitutions of the Order or from its unwritten laws. Such a power vested in the person of, and exercised by, a single individual holding but a subordinate station in the great Masonic family, would, in the opinion of your committee, be dangerous to the privileges and subversive of the rights of the members of the Fraternity. It would subject the brethren to be controlled by the whims and caprices of an ignorant or overbearing and tyrannical Master, who, charmed by the fascinations of power, might forget right.

Your committee are of opinion, after a careful investigation of the subject, that should such an unhappy state of things exist in a subordinate Lodge during its session that its quiet is likely to be disturbed, the Master has the right to close his Lodge, in order to prevent such disturbance, or adjourn it from one Stated Meeting to another, and no longer; and it is his duty in such a state of things to report the case to the Grand Master, who may, if he thinks proper, suspend the working of the Lodge until the meeting of the Grand Lodge, which alone, as before remarked, has the power to arrest and recall the Charter.

*Resolved*, That Brothers YELL and TANNEHILL be a committee to wait upon and communicate the thanks of this Grand Lodge to the M. W. Past Grand Master, WILL. E. KENNEDY, for the ability, zeal, and impartiality he has manifested for the good of the Craft since he has presided over the deliberations of this Grand Lodge.

The following report was received and concurred in:

Your committee, to whom was referred the petition of sundry brethren residing in and near the town of Cairo, praying for a Dispensation authorizing them to form a Lodge in the town of Cairo, Tennessee, to be called King Hiram Lodge, No. —, beg leave to report that they are of opinion that a Dispensation ought to be granted them according to their prayer, and recommend the same to the Grand Lodge; also, that they take into their possession and use (as a loan) the jewels and furniture that belonged to St. John's Lodge, No. 27, formerly held in Cairo, and return or account for them at the next Grand Lodge.

Your committee are also of opinion that a Dispensation be granted upon the petition of sundry brethren at Washington, Rhea county, and that it be called Aurora Lodge, No. —, and that they use, upon loan, until the next meeting of this Grand Lodge, the jewels and furniture of the Lodge formerly held at that place. They would recommend that THOS. J. HAZLERIG be first Master, JAMES BERRY be first Senior Warden, and ROBERT LOCK be first Junior Warden.

Your committee are of opinion that no Dispensation should be granted upon the petition of sundry brethren at Murfreesboro.

The Committee on Dispensations presented a report, which was received and concurred in; but, on motion, that concurrence was re-considered, and the report referred back to the committee.

The Grand Lodge again resumed its labors, according to adjournment.

The Committee on Dispensations made the following report, which was received and concurred in:

*To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Tennessee:*

Your committee, to whom was referred the business of Dispensations, ask leave to report that we have examined the By-laws and returns of Hess Lodge, No. 93, the returns of which are not in full, but, from the information of the Delegate from that Lodge (Brother McGINNIS), we recommend to this Grand Lodge that they receive a Charter.

We have also examined the By-laws and return of King Solomon Lodge, No. 94; we find nothing in them that is contrary to our ancient usages of Masonry. We have not a full transcript of their proceedings, as required by the Grand Lodge, but, from the information of Brother BELL, the Master of that Lodge, we also recommend to this Grand Lodge that they also have a Charter.

*Resolved*, That a Charter issue to King Solomon Lodge, No. 94, and that

Brother JOHN BELL be first Master, Brother GEORGE W. PARKER be first Senior Warden, and Brother SAMUEL R. ANDERSON be first Junior Warden of said Lodge. Also, a Charter to Hess Lodge, No. 93, and that Brother JAMES SMITH be first Master, MARCUS MITCHELL first Senior Warden, and S. HALE first Junior Warden.

Which resolution was adopted by the Grand Lodge.

On motion, the fees for conferring Degrees on a clergyman in Hess Lodge were remitted.

The Committee on Foreign Communications beg leave to report that they have examined the Proceedings of the Grand Lodges of Missouri, North Carolina, Alabama, Maryland, Massachusetts, Florida, Indiana, Kentucky, and New York, and that in the Proceedings of the Grand Lodge of Alabama, they find the following resolution:

*"Resolved*, That all the Grand Lodges in correspondence with the Grand Lodge of Alabama be requested to elect one Delegate, to meet in General Convention, on the first Monday in March, 1842, in the city of Washington, for the purpose of determining upon a uniform mode of work throughout all the Lodges of the United States, and to make other lawful regulations for the interest and security of the Craft."

Which they beg leave to submit to the consideration of the Grand Lodge, and recommend a non-concurrence therein.

In the communication from the Grand Lodge of Missouri, your committee find the attention of this Grand Lodge requested to the following preamble and resolutions, to wit:

*"WHEREAS*, It has been represented to this Grand Lodge that, in many States of these United States, a system has obtained among subordinate Lodges, of merely opening in the Degrees of E. A. or Fellow Craft, and in those Degrees performing the work of the Lodge; that this practice has been (at least silently) acquiesced in by their respective Lodges; and, whereas, this Grand Lodge consider such system as conflicting with the ancient landmarks of Masonry, one of which declares that the members of all working Lodges should be Master Masons, and even with us, in these modern days, none are considered competent to open or hold a Lodge, or work as a Lodge, unless they be Master Masons. The Degrees of E. A. and F. C. are, of necessity, the mere appendages to a Lodge of which Apprentices and Fellow Crafts cannot legitimately be members, and, consequently, prohibited any participation in the work of the Lodge. They are merely candidates for Mastership and membership. In each of the Degrees of E. A. and F. C., those candidates must serve a probationary term before they can attain the rank of Master, or claim any of the privileges thereto annexed. Lodges, as such, cannot consistently work as Apprentices or Fellow Crafts, even provided none but Masters be present, and, in the opinion of this Grand Lodge, no business can legitimately be transacted in those Degrees, other than lecturing, the examination of candidates for advancement, or in the conferring of the Degree. Many other reasons why a change should be made in this mode of working suggest themselves, but which it would not be proper to record, and, it being desirable that an interchange of opinion upon

WHEREAS, The following resolution, introduced by Brother E. HOWARD at the last Grand Annual Communication, was laid on the table, and referred to this Grand Annual Communication; and whereas, it embodies an essential principle of true Masonic charity; therefore,

"Resolved, That it is the sense of this Grand Lodge that no brother has a right to the charities or privileges of the Order who withdraws from the Fraternity, and does not in any way contribute to its support, when he has the ability so to do."

The following resolution was offered by Brother BURTON:

*Resolved*, That in order to insure greater uniformity, no Deputy Grand Master shall enter on the discharge of his official duties, save in open Grand Lodge, until he shall have first fully conferred with the Grand Master in reference to all the work and Lectures of the three first symbolic Degrees of Masonry.

The resolution was adopted.

The following report was presented and read:

The Committee on Unfinished Business beg leave to report that they have examined the printed Proceedings of the Grand Lodge at its last Grand Annual Communication. The new Constitution submitted to the subordinate Lodges is believed to be the most important business yet unfinished. From documents placed in their hands by the Grand Secretary, they find that a constitutional number of the subordinate Lodges have not adopted it. The committee believe the Constitution proposed a most excellent one. They recommend the adoption of the following resolutions:

"Resolved, That the subordinate Lodges under the jurisdiction of this Grand Lodge which have not acted upon the new Constitution, submitted to them at the last Grand Annual Communication, are hereby required to do so at the first stated meeting of each Lodge after it shall have received a notice from the Grand Secretary, expressing the will of the Grand Lodge upon the subject."

"Resolved, That as soon as it is convenient, after it is ascertained that a constitutional number of the Lodges have adopted it, the Grand Master notify the subordinate Lodges that the same is of full force and authority."

The undersigned, the Committee on By-laws, would respectfully report that they have examined the By-laws of Tannehill Lodge, No. 116; Harrison Lodge, No. 114; Elkton Lodge, No. 24; Benton Lodge, No. 111; Cornersville Lodge, No. 126, and find them correct.

The committee recommend that the 5th<sup>\*</sup> section of article 5th of the By-laws of Maeon Lodge, No. 120, be so amended as to make the time twelve months, when an applicant for initiation has been rejected, before he shall be entitled to the privilege of a second application. Otherwise, the committee think the By-laws correct.

The committee recommend that sections 6th† and 7th‡ of article 3d, and also
