Later from Kansas. ST. LOUIS, Aug. 23.

Advices from Lawrence to Aug. 17 mention that nearly 500 Free State men marched upon what is called Col. Titus' camp, near Lecompton. and took 20 persons prisoners. Ten of the Free State party were wounded, among them Captain Schombree, recently from Richmond, Indiana. It is thought he will not survive. Col. Titus is also badly injured. The

prisoners were taken to Lawrence. Gov. Shannon, Major Sedgwick and Dr. Roderick, of Lecompton, went to Lawrence on the 17th to demand their release.

After a conference it was agreed that when 6 of the Free-State prisoners held by the authorities were delivered up, and the howitzer taken from Lawrence returned, and all the camps of armed Pro-Slavery men dispersed, the prisoners should be released.
