Whereas the Proclamation of the 10th

inst., rejecting the so-called election

returns from the colored people in John

son County, another similar case has

been presented for our official action. It

is that of pretended returns from three

parishes of Missouri, in this Territory,

containing an aggregate of more than

two hundred voters. This County

is located in the extreme south-eastern

corner of Kansas, is contiguous to John

son County, and is bounded on the south

by the Cherokee Indians which are not

yet open to pre-emption or settlement,

and is consequently one of the most

sparsely populated counties of the Terri-

tory, containing less than one hundred

qualified voters, and granting that, but

fourteen voters for Delegates to the Con-

stitutional Convention.

I find all persons actually enumerated

with the number of the population of this

county, with the date of the large vote

pretended to have been given there. Our

information also shows that there was

no such election in Missouri, where the

people do not seem to have interfered

with the election. It is, then, quite evi-

dent that no such vote is presented in

these pretended returns as given at the

late election in this County.

It is also shown that the persons who

stated that they rejected these pretended

returns, but feeling confident that no such

vote was given, or even one-fifth part

of the vote, have been so grossly mis-

taken as to give these alleged returns, the

most right of which, in order to ascertain

whether they are genuine, legal, and valid.

From intrinsic evidence on the face of

the returns, we are convinced that they

are not genuine, but are the work of

fraud, and are, therefore, null and void.
