MORRIS, JUDGE, &c., BY MR. McARTHUR, ESQ., OF THIS PLACE, IN SUPPORT OF THE MANDAMUS, IN A MOST THOROUGH, ABLE AND USTERY MANNER. THE DECISION OF THE MANDAMUS WAS RESERVED BY THE COURT FOR MATURATION OF THE OPINIONS OF THE OFFICERS OF THE COURT AND OTHER GOVERNMENT OFFICERS WERE PRESENT.**
