PROCLAMATION.

In pursuance of the third section of the Constitution to provide for the formation of a Territorial Government, the Legislature of the State of Kansas, a majority of the legal voters of the Territory having declared themselves in favor of the formation of a Constitution and State Government,

I, SAMUEL MEDARY, Governor of the Territory of Kansas, do proclaim, as the law requires,

That an election shall be held on the first Tuesday of June, at the several voting precincts in the Territory of Kansas, for delegates to a convention to frame a Constitution and State Government for the State of Kansas.
