**Veto Power--the Legislative Power, &c., &c.,**

from its own interests, and to large-  
 ly its own course and actions; that  
 the preponderant majority of the whole  
 people are in favor of the measure  
 proposed to be declared; and whatever  
 course, therefore, with this theory, tends  
 to the intervention of the system, and subjects  
 the majority to the power of the  
 minority. We have thus briefly stated the  
 authority assumed by the advocates of the  
 measure, not, perhaps in the exact order  
 in which it was presented to the public,  
 but in our own peculiar phraseology, but  
 probably in a method sufficiently regular  
 and sufficiently comprehensive and  
 explicit.

Before entering upon a direct examination  
 of the several positions and argu-  
 ments of the advocates of the measure,  
 we have to say that we have heard  
 our opponents—we would remark that  
 we have heard our opponents with  
 intrinsic importance of the vote power,  
 it is necessary to contemplate the deep  
 difficulties with which it was regarded by  
 the advocates of the measure, and we  
 formed the Federal Constitution.

It is thoroughly well they conveyed  
 the power to the Executive, and we  
 of legislative branch of the government,  
 it was proposed, in the first instance,  
 to the Executive, and we have seen  
 on, in his plan of a constitution, took  
 extreme ground, while many mem-  
 bers of the Convention were in the

 and unanimity. The question at  
 issue was merely regarded the extent to which  
 that principle should be carried. It was  
 not a question of principle, but of  
 discussion and matured reflection—proposed  
 that the President be given by a qual-  
 ity of the House, and that the  
 Senate, on the 12th of July, 1787,  
 "The tenth Resolution, it was  
 that the President shall have a right to negative  
 the third of each branch," was passed  
 by a vote of 10 to 3.

The measure in the Constitution vesting  
 in the President with a qualified negative  
 was as follows:

"Every bill which shall have passed  
 both Houses of Congress, shall, before it  
 becomes a law, be presented to the President;  
 if he approve of it, he shall sign it, and  
 it shall, after being signed by him, be  
 sent to the House of Representatives, to  
 the Senate, or to the President, to be  
 signed, or to be vetoed. If he veto it,  
 it shall be sent to the House of Repre-  
 sentatives, and to the Senate, to be  
 reconsidered. If, after such reconsideration,  
 two thirds of the House, shall agree to  
 pass the bill, it shall be sent to the  
 Senate, to be reconsidered. If, after  
 such reconsideration, two thirds of the  
 Senate, shall agree to pass the bill,  
 it shall be sent to the President, to be  
 signed, or to be vetoed. If he veto it,  
 it shall be sent to the House of Repre-  
 sentatives, and to the Senate, to be
