THE PEACE IN KANSAS.

Governor Geary has secured what is called "prace in Kansas," in a way not at all unacceptable to the Border Ruffians. He has induced the Free State men to lay down their

arms; arrested more than two hundred of them; called into the field eight hundred United States dragoons, whose their business seems to be the pursuit of the Free State leaders; enrolled a large portion of the "Army of Law and Order," which came to destroy Lawrence, as Territorial militis, and placed them

under the command of Colonel Titus, one of the officers of the Law and Order Army, recommended for the purpose by Atthison; and issued his proclamation for an election of Territorial Delegate, Ac. No woulder the St. Louis Republican is satisfied. The laws distranchising the Free State men remain in force. They cannot vote without violating their conscientious convictions, and degrading themselves. ProSlayery men have the supervision of every-

tious convictions, and neground members, Pro-Slavery men have the supervision of everything. Colonel Titus, with his Missoori militis, will, we suppose, guard the polls. Alterady Mr. Whitfield is in the field as the Pro-Slavery candidate, and his election, we presume, is a foregone conclusion. We have not yet learned that the Free State men have a candidate. They are down, under the heel of the Administration, and Border Ruffanism finds sheller in the shalow of United States troops.
