

FOR THE FIRE VICTIMS.

KEY WEST, Fla., April 2,—Rice, Born & Co., of New-Orleans, have sent \$100 to relieve the destitute families, the Bank of Jacksonville \$500 additional, making \$1,500 in all; C. W. Jones, \$100; F. O. Howe, of Pensacola, \$25; the villages of Fort Myers and Punta Rassa \$500 and \$73 respectively; W. D. Chipley, \$50, and Thurber, Whyland & Co., \$100. The Spanish ram Jorge Juan took 800 Cubans to Havana. B. W. Allen, of New-York, has telegraphed to L. W. Pierce an order for 50 barrels of flour to relieve the destitute. Buildings are being bought and moved to the burned district for temporary use. Measures are being taken to immediately rebuild the wharves and warehouses. There was a meeting of the Board of Aldermen to-night to arrange a fire limit and to take other steps toward securing future protection against fire.
