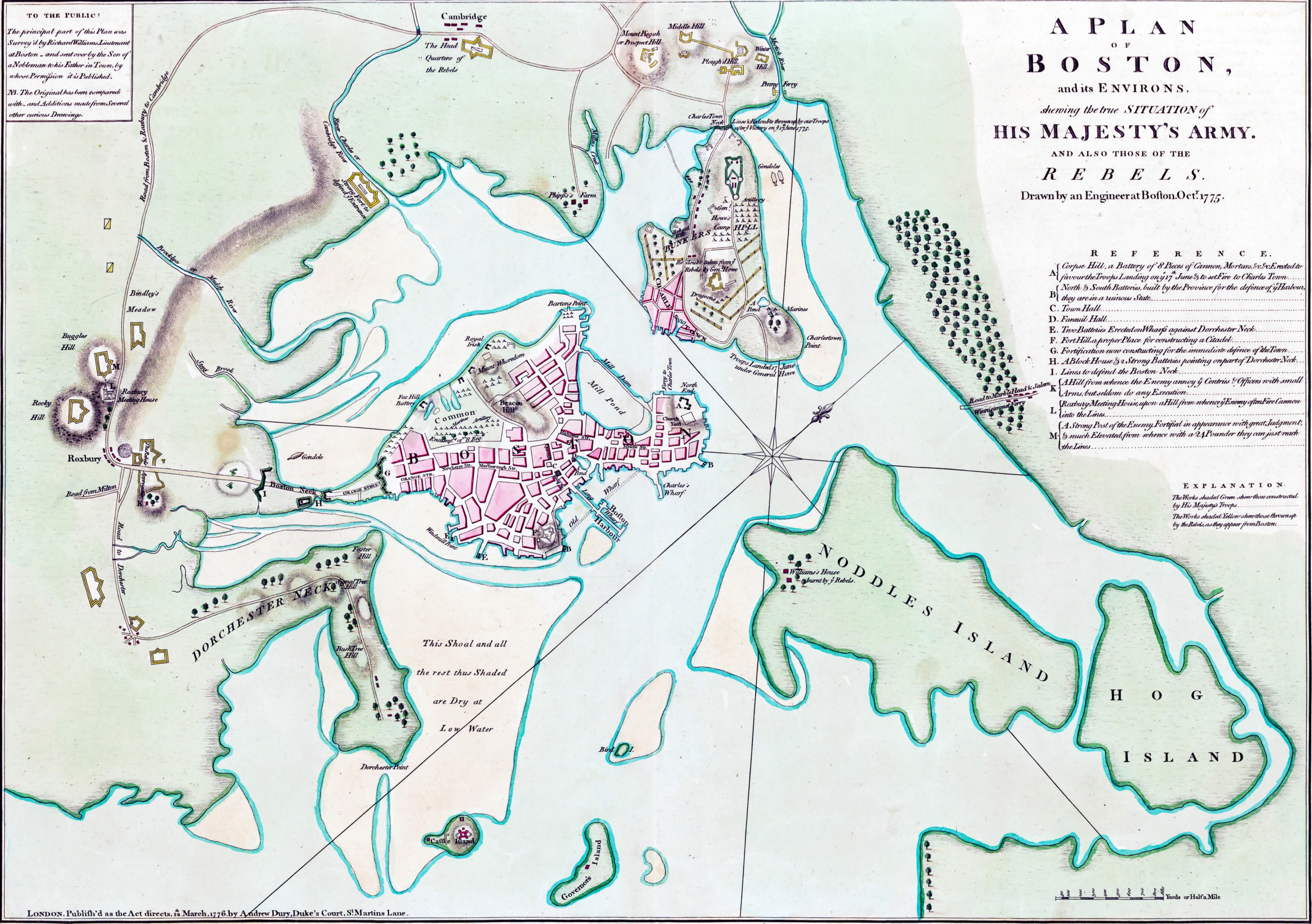


TO THE PUBLIC.

- REFERENCE.
- A. Corpse Hill, a Battery of 8 Pieces of Cannon, Mortars, &c. Erected to favour the Troops Landing on y^e 17th June to set Fire to Charles Town.
 - B. North & South Batteries, built by the Province for the defence of y^e Harbour, they are in a ruinous State.
 - C. Town Hall.
 - D. Fanueil Hall.
 - E. Two Batteries Erected on Wharfs against Dorchester Neck.
 - F. Fort Hill, a proper Place for constructing a Citadel.
 - G. Fortification now constructing for the immediate defence of the Town.
 - H. A Block House & 2 Strong Batteries pointing on part of Dorchester Neck.
 - I. Lines to defend the Boston Neck.
 - J. A Hill from whence the Enemy annoy y^e Centries & Officers with small Arms, but seldom do any Execution.
 - K. Roxbury Meeting House, upon a Hill from whence y^e Enemy often fire Cannon into the Lines.
 - L. A Strong Post of the Enemy Fortified in appearance with great Judgment, & much Elevated, from whence with a 24 Pounder they can just reach the Lines.
