

FOR NICARAGUA.—The steamer Texas left yesterday for Nicaragua, having on board 440 emigrants in the steerage, with several officers of the Nicaraguan army, and a number of families. Among the officers was Col. F. F. Mancoske, the Nicaraguan agent at this port, who goes, we understand, to learn the true state of things in regard to Walker's prospects. He takes a considerable quantity of provisions, &c. The Texas was detained until 4 o'clock awaiting the arrival of the John Simonds, on board of which are about one hundred men, under Col. Titus, from St. Louis. The Simonds not arriving, she sailed without them.—*N. O. Bulletin*, 29th.
