20 By the last account from Nicaragua we learn that Col. Lockridge, having succeeded in getting up an old steamboat, and being reinforced by the arrival of Col. Titus with some 250 men, had forced his war up the San Juan river and beaten the Allies at Cody's Point and Serapiqui. Walker's forces | were at San Juan del Sur and Rivas. He had made two attacks on the Costa Ricans. at St. George's and Obraje; but in each instance was obliged to retire before the superior numbers of the enemy. It was expected that Lockridge's men would soon be able to form a junction with Walker. Another battle was expected on the 4th inst.
