If you get time to write, I would like to know what the men at Danbury feel about "Watergate" and what is happening with Nixon. How do they feel about the impeachment of our President? Also, what do the Cubans in Danbury feel about going back to Cuba?

Bill, if you can write to me, let me know if I can mail you some books. I have a couple of good ones for you.
