Bomb Hurts 3 at Cuban Mission

New York, N.Y. —UPI—Right-wing Cuban exiles crept past a 24 hour police guard at the Cuban mission to the United Nations and planted a time bomb that exploded Saturday, injuring three men, including a policeman and a mission guard, police said.

Police described the damage to the mission and a number of parked cars as extensive. Windows in the Japanese mission next door were shattered.

Within an hour of the blast on E. 67th St., a caller to United Press International said the bombing was carried out by Omega 7, a group of Cuban exiles living in the US.

The caller, speaking with a Spanish accent, said: "This bombing was in reply to (Cuban President Fidel) Castro's intention to re-establish relations with the US and the recent dialog with some traitors from the Cuban community in the US."

Police were hampered in the investigation by Cuban diplomats who barred them from entering the mission. Police have no jurisdiction on the mission grounds.
