Bomb Hits Miami Cigar Factory; Phone Call Links Foes of Castro

MIAMI, Jan. 13 (AP) — A bomb exploded against the door of a cigar factory in Miami's Little Havana section early today, causing "significant damage," the police said.

There were no injuries, a police spokesman said, and there was no immediate

estimate of damages.

The homemade bomb exploded at 12:40 A.M. at the Padron Cigars factory, the police said. A caller to The Associated Press said that a group of Cuban exiles opposed to President Fidel Castro of Cuba had set the bomb.

The caller said the bombing was the work of Omega Seven, an anti-Communist group that took responsibility for bombings at the Cuban mission in New York in December and October.
