

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 46,714 for 80 acres, issued in favor of *Adeline Heaskins, William Heaskins and James Heaskins, minor children of James Heaskins, deceased, Private in Captain Geogh's Company, Florida Militia, Florida War,*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *East Half of the North East Quarter of Section Eleven, in Township Three, South, of Range Twenty-five East; in the District of Texas subject to sale at St. Augustine Florida, containing Eighty Acres and Thirty-seven hundredths of an Acre,*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *Which has been assigned to Henry S. Titus,*

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Henry S. Titus,*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Henry S. Titus, and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof, I, *Franklin Pierce* PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the SEAL OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE to be hereunto affixed.
