

**A Counterfeiter Lynched.**

INDIANAPOLIS, Jan. 28.—On Tuesday a mob at Ligonier arrested three counterfeiters. One of them they hanged. They were proceeding to execute the second, when it was agreed by the majority to let the law take its course. The third one, who was guilty of making bogus coin, was delivered into the hands of the United States deputy marshal and brought here to-day for trial. He was held in \$2 000 bail, in default of which he was committed to jail.

**From the Army in Utah.**

ST. LOUIS, Jan. 30.—the Utah correspondent of the St. Louis Republican, states that Captain Marcy is expected back in the middle of April. After transportation is effected, Col.
