BOSTON, March 14. Extract of a Letter from Rhode-island, dated March 1; What follows is an Abstract of a Letter from New London, which is confirmed by Word of Mouth by a credible Perfon. " Mr. Devenbort came lately to New-London (as was supposed to ordain Mr. Curtis) and gave Thanks to God among other Mercies for his lame Leg, which obliges him to be carried about in a Chair. He warned a Fast--- for only the Children of God, because fefus was to be among them .-- Many were refused Admittance, even of the New-Lights, to their great Mortification --- At last the Lord revealed to them, that they must publickly burn a Number of Books. This they performed with great Solemnity last Lords Day, P. M. the Saints singing round the Bonsire,

Glory, Glory, Glory ;--- and Monday Night last they would have burnt some more, but the " Mob prevented them .--- Davenport then told the dear Children of God, that some of them made Idols of their gay Cloaths; on which they fought the Lard whether those Idols ought to be burnt too .--- After which one faid it was e revealed to him that they must not be burnt; 6 another that his Things should be burnt .---A Strife arising, Davenpart order'd all the Things to be brought to him, till the Lord hould determine the Cafe. -- Hereon the Women brought in their Scarlet Cloaks, Velvet Hoods, fine Laces, and every Thing that had two Colours; fo that it is supposed the . Heap of Women's Idols, and the Men's Wigs, Velvet Collars, &c. &c. is worth three or four hundred Pounds.' March 21. By Persons lately come from New-London, we are informed, that fome of the Books burnt there by Order of Mr. Davenport and other Inquisitors, were Bishop

Beveridge's Private Thoughts on Religion, Dyer's Golden Chain, Ruffel's Seven Ser. mons, the New-England Pfalms, and the Sermons of some of the present Ministers of this

Town. It is well if the BIBLE does not undergo the same Fate, when another burning

Fit comes upon those Reformers. It is faid,

however, that the Pile of Velvet Hoods, Scarlet Cloaks, Wigs and other Idols at New

London, is reprieved from the Flames(for the present ) by Mr. Davenport, and that every

Bird has taken its own Feather again.
